Women Owned Businesses

According to the 2012 U.S. Census data, approximately one third of the businesses in Lake County are owned, in whole or part, by women. In our downtown Libertyville, approximately 60 shops, restaurants and service businesses are owned by female entrepreneurs, whether through sole ownership, family businesses, husband and wife teams, or friends. As one of the youngest business owners, Kendra from Serendipity, explained, "Running the company with three generations has been the biggest blessing. Each of us brings something different to the table and the store contains a little of each of us."

So what is the draw of owning and operating a business in downtown Libertyville? A random survey of these creative and savvy ladies, ranging from 30 years downtown to newcomers, referred to the "historic and quaint feeling of the downtown." For some, like Amazing Cosmetics owners, Sue and Lisa, Libertyville is home. Their business began in Sue's house, and as it grew they moved it to downtown Libertyville. When it came time to expand again, they felt it was important to invest in the community by purchasing a building. Other businesses chose Libertyville to raise their family, opening their businesses after first living here as residents.

Community support is a common thread echoed by many of the business owners. Shelly, from Allure, summed it up: "I have felt very supported by the community and the MainStreet organization. Folks want to see the downtown businesses thrive." Karen from Charles and Minerva added, "The merchants work together."

As every entrepreneur knows – and as women entrepreneurs experience more than most – successful business ownership is not about doing what's easy. They are not blind to the hard realities of juggling business ownership and family – they are bold despite them. It's about finding your passion – and working hard to achieve success. Women owned businesses, we salute – and support you!

Letter from the Chairman

As you may know, the Village of Libertyville is updating the Comprehensive plan. Updated every 10 years or so, this plan is a guide for the Village and other organizations that outlines what we, as a community, want our town to look like as changes occur in the area. Main Street is actively participating in this planning process and the development of the plan is expected to take the next 10-12 months.

The first open house was in July and it showcased where we are as a community and offered the opportunity for residents to weigh in on different ideas regarding development, aesthetics and land use in the Village. If you have not taken advantage of the open houses and pop-up forums yet, I encourage you to participate in the process and take a look at the great work this team is doing to bring this plan to life.

From Main Street's point of view, our goal in the process is simple: maintain the historic look and feel of the town, while providing space for people to come together to enjoy the events that we sponsor in town throughout the year.

Downtown Historic District Designation

Recently the Village of Libertyville Board of Trustees voted unanimously to create a downtown historic district, thereby revising the duties of the Historic Preservation Commission with increased regulatory functions. The new district is comprised entirely of commercial structures, including three designated on the National Register of Historic Places: Cook Mansion, the Public Service Building (Harris Bank) and the Procter Building. The new Ordinance would affect any changes proposed for the exteriors only, such as facades or signage. In the case of demolition, a plan for a structure that is appropriate or compatible to the area would be reviewed. The new designation does not add a layer of Village approval but instead replaces the current Appearance Review Commission approval process with the Village Board having final approval.

Jim Hartshorne, Chairman of the Historic Preservation Commission stated, "Libertyville is a great town with a good number of older well preserved buildings and has now benefited by having the Historic Preservation Ordinance in place to preserve the historic value, integrity and quality that the residents expect."

"We found in all our research that property values are higher within communities with historic preservation areas and districts," Commissioner Mike Kollman said. "Rates of appreciation are higher as well." He added, "Another incentive is that tax credits are available to owners of historically protected property."

Elite and recreational runners, first-time racers, family and jog stroller-pushers enjoy the 3.12-mile route through our charming Libertyville neighborhoods. The Twilight Shuffle is one of MainStreet Libertyville's top fundraisers and an evening of fun for the entire family. The race offers professional chip-timing, a course with some moderate hills and many enthusiastic spectators. Enhancing the community environment of the run is the post-race party held at Mickey Finn's Brewery, where everyone can enjoy dinner and rehydration.

Register closes at 10am on September 2nd!

To keep the Twilight Shuffle safe and organized, the last opportunity for racers to register will be on race morning on September 2nd from 8-10am at the packet pick-up location, The Runner's Edge, 524 N. Milwaukee, Libertyville. Race morning registration is the last chance to register! No walk-up registration at the race.



Event Highlights

The Twilight Shuffle is a family event, welcoming racers ages 9 and up with several award categories under age 18. We are offering technical t-shirts that are dri-fit fabric and race photos will be available to download for free.

We celebrate family participation with several unique award categories. The Fit Family Award is given to the family that registers the most participants. The Fast Family award is given to the family of three or more (one member must be under the age of 17) with the fastest average time. Winning families will receive an award and will have their name engraved on a plaque on display in the MainStreet Libertyville office.

Runners are organized by waves based on projected pace per mile. Volunteers holding signs will help guide runners into waves as they line up to start. Remember, your start time starts when you cross the starting mats, not when the starting horn sounds. We appreciate your cooperation and encourage everyone to line up according to average pace per mile and enjoy the company of the participants around you.



The Twilight Shuffle depends on capable volunteers who keep the race safe and organized. There are plenty of opportunities to help out on Friday, Saturday and Sunday and especially on the race course itself, where you'll also have a great view of the race.
